Plan Ahead and Prepare	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prepare food and storage for use of bear bags • Know that vehicles must be parked in the corral areas after unloading • Bring white gas or propane stoves for cooking – NO FIRES IN CAMPSITES • Bring trash bags to pack out all trash 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bring backpacking containers in dry season; water filters for Calamity Creek drainage in spring • Vehicles must be parked in corral areas after unloading. • Cook with backpacking stoves only; use fire rings when available. • Bring trash bags to pack out all trash
Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vehicles allowed only on the main road; equipment must be carried to the assigned campsites from the road. • No off road vehicle use allowed. • Camp in reserved, designated sites <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Elk and Confluence Camps by corral - Corral area large group site - Rendevous camp ¼ mile up Calamity Creek - 1 site near eastern boundary alongside McKay Creek (McKay Cr Camp) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Camp in designated sites when possible • Camp on bare durable surfaces when possible. • Spread out if not camping on durable surfaces; minimize impact on grass and soil. • Hike on roads or trails when available.
Dispose of Waste Properly	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dispose of wash water (grey water) in sumps provided; • Bring trash bags to remove all trash. • Bring spatula to clean food from sump screens • Use camp toilets for human waste; empty and clean per instructions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pack out all trash. • Dispose of grey water and human waste water at least 200 feet from stream or drainage • Use “cat holes” for solid human waste (pit toilet if available) at least 200 feet from stream or drainage.

Minimize Campfire Impacts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cook with gas stoves in provided fire ring Fires allowed Oct 1 to May 15. • Group campfires allowed in corral campfire area UNLESS EXTREME FIRE HAZARD. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cook with gas stoves in provided fire ring or on bare soil or rock. NO FIRES in back country!
Respect Wildlife	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Observe but don’t harass wildlife. • Leave cattle alone. • Know that mountain lions and bears frequent RMSC; go over lion and bear safety procedures with all participants. • Hang all smellables in bear bags or in locked cars overnight. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Observe but don’t harass wildlife. • Leave cattle alone. • Know that mountain lions and bears frequent RMSC; go over lion and bear safety procedures with all participants. • Hang all smellables in bear bags
